The 1.5-kilometre Port Germein jetty is the longest in South Australia and was once the longest in the Southern Hemisphere. Purpose built in 1881 to service the grain export industry, the jetty had to be built extra-long to cater for the low tides that occur along the Spencer Gulf. Port Germein is where the Flinders Ranges truly meet the sea. Located 27 kilometres north of Port Pirie on National Highway One, Port Germein is a tranquil and safe holiday haven, especially for families with young children. Port Germein is a popular resort town as evidenced by the many holiday shacks located here. Port Germein is on the fringe of the "Remarkable Southern Flinders" proposal, is a concept put forward by community partners to further advance and promote the Southern Flinders region as a tourism destination. Together these partners put forward the "Remarkable Southern Flinders" proposal to the Australian Government and were successful in securing \$5million from the Building Better Regions Fund.
